(2) Hezekiah Goff, 2nd, (A4) was married to Annah Ward, in Middletown, Conn., in 1774. Hezekiah died in Richford, Vt., February 27, 1848, aged ninety-five. His wife died January 1811, aged sixty-one. Annah married Joshua Whitney, who went away privateering, and was never heard from. Betsey married John Combs of Richford, Vt. Hezekiah, born in Sunderland, Mass., married Sally Willard. William, born in Sunderland, Mass., Sept. at, 1783, married Abigail Blaisdell, in Richford, Vt. William died about 1871; Abigail in 1873. Both are resting in the old cemetery, in Richford. On their monument are engraved these words from II Peter 3:13. "Nevertheless we, according to His promise, look for a new Heaven and new earth, wherein dwelleth righteousness."

Clara married Bradford Powell; her second husband was Enoch Carlton, who had been a Revolutionary soldier. Abigail married Ephraim Corliss and had twelve children. Polly married Prosper Powell. Lucinda married Asa Smith. Seth lived in Wisconsin. Johnathan and Polly in Three Rivers, Massachusetts.
